
Is Technology a Blessing or a Curse?

People did not wash their hands, and when they did it was usually with shared, dirty water. This led to Cholera.... Cholera is an intestinal disease caused by contaminated water.

Moreover, another example of technology being a curse is the invention of the Cotton Gin (Separated Seed from Cotton Fibers). Although the Cotton Gin allowed cotton to make 1000 pounds per day, it had many bad effects. This invention, led to the invention of Plantations. Plantations are large farms. On Plantations, slavery was much harsher. Slaves were toiled in large groups and watched over by foreman. Slaves were needed to work plantations in order produce cotton efficiently. Everyone along the cotton belt (Band of states stretching from South Carolina to Texas) were "Slave-Dependent" they needed slaves to run Cotton Gins. The Cotton Gin, encouraged and increased slavery.

Furthermore, some more examples of inventions were John Deeres Steel Plow, and the Steam Boat. The Steel Plow (Cut through heavy soil) caused farmers to lose their jobs since they were being replaced by machines. This led to urbanization, and to more dangerous overcrowded, cities. The Steamboat, although many people say it was a blessing because it ran on steam

power, traveled upriver, against currents and it was faster, it was not. The Steamboat put many canals out of business. The canals, such as the Erie Canal, helped many farmers ship products quickly and inexpensively. Settlement and development in the Great Lakes Region increased. Due to the Steamboat putting canals out of business, this most likely decreased.
